

WHY GET IMMUNISED AGAINST INFLUENZA?

Influenza is a very contagious infection of the airways. It affects people of all ages but can be very serious for the elderly. Although it can be a mild disease for some, it can also cause very serious illness in otherwise healthy people. Vaccination is a safe and effective way to protect you and your loved one from this serious disease. The more people who are vaccinated in your community, the less likely the disease will spread.



Flu symptoms can include runny nose, sneezing, cough, sore throat, fever, chills, headache and body aches. Symptoms usually start about 1 to 3 days after catching the flu and can last for a week or more. Please note that a common cold is not the same as the flu, although some of the symptoms are similar. A 2024 Influenza (flu) vaccination is recommended every year to reduce the risk of becoming ill with the flu. The best way to protect yourself and your family is to have the flu vaccine. Rembrandt Court have arranged a 2024 Resident Flu clinic on Wednesday 8th May, 2024. If you have any concerns please chat to a Nurse or a member of Doctor John Lehmann's team.

UNLABELED ITEMS AT REMBRANDT COURT


